Introduction

The following manual is dedicated to users who join the platform www.mastertheact.eu.

The website <u>www.mastertheact.eu</u> is the official website of the Erasmus+ Project "Master the Act" and it includes also a learning platform developed by the project partners to train the future Creative Mentor for Employability.

The mission of the MACT Project

The main purpose of the "Master the Act" is to develop and train a new professional profile: **the Creative Mentor for Employability (CME)**, a professional able to support jobseekers in developing their employability by the use of a methodology broader than the FakeltMakelt one, that keeps including not formal and theatrical techniques and combines them with mentoring techniques and professional development.

Therefore, the MACT Methodology aims to upskill and broaden the working methods of two target groups:

- the **job facilitators and enablers** (HR managers, recruitment specialists, career counsellors, public and private employment agencies);
- the **theatre professionals** (in particular, the theatre trainers and educators).

Main actions and outputs

In order to reach this goal, the partners of the project conducted research at the European level, in order to define a professional profile of the CME that includes all the key competencies necessary for the Creative Mentor of Employability.



After this, they developed and tested a training methodology specifically designed for the Creative Mentors of Employability.

The entire methodology is contained in the MACT Handbook (PART II and PART III), along with the MACT Training Box (PART IV), a collection of tools and practical activities that the CME can use in his work with job seekers.

The partners of the MACT Project have also developed **an online course for the CMEs** that is available on the project learning platform: https://mastertheact.eu/register/. The purpose of the MACT learning platform is also to bring together all the European CMEs and give them a common space for sharing and professional development.

The context of the project

The "Master the Act" Project is part of a broader European framework of designing and developing training programmes for European professionals that aim to improve a complex and essential skill set like digital skills, emotional intelligence, creative thinking, interpersonal and communication skills, leadership and teamwork, along with global competence needed to thrive in a changing labour market.

In this regard, it supports the accomplishment of the <u>17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDG)</u>, especially SDG 8 (Promoting sustained, inclusive and sustainable economic growth, full and productive employment and decent work for all).

Likewise, it raises awareness about opportunities offered to Europeans looking for a job and funds dedicated to SMEs (Small and Medium-sized Enterprises) for helping them hire European professionals.

The home page includes also a video presentation of the project.








The CME Professional Profile


The page includes also links to the online course (IO3) to become a creative mentor for employability in all language versions.



Online course presentation


The Online Training page (Intellectual Output 3 - IO3) contains the presentation of the online course to become Creative Mentor for Employability with links and basic information about the six training modules, plus the chance to enroll on the course or log in/register to do it.

The course consists of 6 training modules of about 2 hours each and includes video lectures, exercises and the MACT handbook. which contains in-depth material and more than 60 activities for unemployed persons and job seekers.

At the end of the course, and on

passing the final quizzes for each module, participants will receive a certificate of attendance and the title of Creative Mentor for Employability.

The MACT Community Section is accessible only to users enrolled on the online course.





This page contains all the newsletters published during the project.




Login Section

Login

The login page allows registered users to log in to the platform or reset their password. It also allows non-registered users to go to the registration page to create a profile.



Profile

Register

The register page allows users to create their own profile on the platform just by filling in the form with data.


1. How to register on the platform?

Once here, you should fill in the form with the required data (first name, last name, username, e-mail, password, and privacy policy acceptance).

If you don't receive the confirmation e-mail, feel free to contact us by sending an e-mail to carlomagni@materahub.com.


3. How to get the Creative Mentor for Employability certificate?

Once you complete the course, you will get a message in which we explain how to get the certificate: simply fill in the platform evaluation form to receive by email the final certificate. The link will be shown at the end of the course.



4. How to apply for the online training course?


If you are registered to the platform, you can enrol the online training. To go into the online training course, you should click on the "Online training" menu voice. Once there, you will see the following screen:




To enroll, you have to click on the button "Take this course", underlined in the screenshot above.



After the click, you will be redirected to the same page but different at the top, as shown below:



Then, you should start the course from the first module just clicking on the related box:



After the click, you will be redirected to the Module 1 page and start to learn. The process is the same for all the modules:










5. Is the online course available in multiple languages?

Yes, the course is available in 6 languages: English, Spanish, Italian, French, Polish, and Romanian. To select your preferred language, please go to the right of the main menu and choose the language as shown in the screenshot below:



6. Why can't I continue with the Course?

There are two main reasons why you cannot go ahead with the online course:

- 1. failure to achieve the minimum result of a quiz;
- 2. the previous module was not completed or passed.

To continue with the course, you must complete the modules and pass the related quizzes in the numerical order in which they appear.

For example, you cannot access Module 2 if you have not completed and passed Module 1.





8. How to open a discussion within the community?


To open a discussion or participate in already published discussions, you need to enter the Community Forum section just clicking on the related menu voice.

Inside there are all the threads created, as you can see from the following screenshot:




To open a new discussion/topic, scroll down the page, where you will find the form to fill in to open a new topic:

Inside you will find all the messages left so far by users and, below, the form for leaving your message:


